- → Step 1: Choose Your Favorite Countries (page 4)
 - ♦ Make a list of six countries you would like to teach in
 - ◆ Choose your top three choices (you can always print out another page to revisit the other choices)
 - ♦ Next we are going to assign a 1, 2, or 3 for each category listed.
 - 1 is poor
 - 2 is average
 - 3 is great
 - ◆ Each category will be scored based on your own preferences and research on each country (i.e. If an area has poor treatment of the LGBTQ+ community and you identify as such you would score it a 1)
 - Please reference page 7 for details on researching each category
 - ♦ Choose the best option (out of 21 points); or the option that scored highest in qualities that matter most to you
- → Step 2: Choose Your Favorite Locations (Page 5)
 - ♦ Make a list of six cities/towns in the country you would like to teach in
 - Choose your top three choices (you can always print out another page to revisit the other choices)
 - ♦ Next we are going to assign a 1, 2, or 3 for each category listed.
 - 1 is poor
 - 2 is average
 - 3 is great
 - ◆ Each category will be scored based on your own preferences and research on each city/town (i.e. If an area is rural and you would prefer a city then you would rate it a 1)
 - Please reference **page 8** for details on researching each category
 - ♦ Choose the best option (out of 24 points); or the option that scored highest in qualities that matter most to you
- → Step 3: Qualified Programs (page 6)
 - Now that we have chosen a location, let's look at some programs that are available there
 - This can be done using a google search for government sponsored programs or looking at private institutions/ job postings
 - There are websites such as <u>TeachAway.com</u>, <u>CIEE.org</u>, <u>GoOverseas.com</u>, <u>ESLCafe.com</u> to find programs or use as a starting point.
 - You can also Google "Teaching jobs in (Your Selected Country/City/Town)" which is my preferred method.
 - You can do this for as many cities/towns that you want, but look at one at a time
 - Make a list of six programs that you qualify for.
 - Choose your top three choices (you can always print out another page to revisit the other choices)
 - ♦ Next we are going to assign a 1, 2, or 3 for each category listed.
 - 1 is poor
 - 2 is average
 - 3 is great
 - ♦ Each category will be scored based on your own preferences and research on each program (i.e. If a program has you working late hours and you prefer mornings then you rate it a 1)
 - Please reference page 9 for details on researching each category
 - ♦ Choose the best option (out of 27 points); or the option that scored highest in qualities that matter most to you

COUNTRY CATEGORIES

- → Language
 - ◆ Are you able to speak the local language? Beginner? Intermediate? Advanced?
 - Are language classes provided, or easily available?
- → Accessibility
 - Does the country have a good inter-city transportation system?
 - Can you easily travel to other countries you wish to visit?
 - Look up multi-entry and single-entry visas for your country
- → Quality of Life
 - Quality of life for various aspects of a country or specific location can be found through a google search or using numbeo.com
 - You may also want to look at individual stories and blogs for a better sense of life as an expat/foreigner
- → Cost of Living
 - Cost of living for various aspects of a country or specific location can be found through a google search or using numbeo.com
- → Crime Rate
 - ♦ Look up various crime statistics:
 - Robbery
 - Gang
 - Sexual Assault
 - Hate Crimes
 - Murder
- → Minority Treatment
 - If you are part of a minority group please check for safety in whatever country you plan to move to
 - Visiting and living in a country with little or no protection can be dangerous and/or detrimental to your mental health
- → Earning Potential
 - ♦ How easily can you save money?
 - Will you be living paycheck to paycheck?
 - Will you need a second job to supplement your income?

LOCATION CATEGORIES

- → City/Rural
 - Mark based on your preference
- → Accessibility
 - ♦ How is public transportation? Is it affordable? Widely available?
 - ♦ Would you need a car? A bike?
 - How accessible are grocery stores, shopping centers, banks, post office, hospitals, etc.?
- → Quality of Life
 - Quality of life for various aspects of a country or specific location can be found through a google search or using numbeo.com
 - You may also want to look at individual stories and blogs for a better sense of life as an expat/foreigner
- → Cost of Living
 - Cost of living for various aspects of a country or specific location can be found through a google search or using numbeo.com
- → Crime Rate
 - Look up various crime statistics:
 - Robbery
 - Gang
 - Sexual Assault
 - Hate Crimes
 - Murder
- → Nearest Embassy
 - Where is the nearest embassy or consulate?
 - ♦ How accessible are they in the event of an emergency?
- → Climate
 - ♦ What is each season like there?
 - How is the humidity?
 - ◆ Are natural disasters frequent or are concern? Hurricane/Typhoon season? Flooding?
- → Entertainment
 - ◆ Are there movie theaters, bowling alleys, skating rinks, etc.?
 - ♦ Are there bars, clubs, concert venues?
 - ♦ Are there amusement parks?
 - ◆ Are there festivals?
 - Are there hiking trails? Scenic views? Beaches? Etc.

PROGRAM CATEGORIES

- → Location
 - Is the school in a good location?
 - ♦ Is the school accessible by public transportation? Car? Walking?
- Airfare
 - ♦ Who pays for your plane ticket there? Leaving the country?
- → Housing
 - Does the school pay for your housing?
 - If so:
 - o Is there a stipend, or does the school directly pays?
 - o If housing is provided, is it near the school?
 - Is there an option to choose your own housing?
 - If not:
 - What is the average cost or rent in the area?
 - o How can you secure housing before or after arriving?
 - o How long are leases?
 - How much are security deposits?
 - Will you live alone or with others? Do you need family housing?
- → Salary
 - Look at average pay for that job in that area and compare it to the school your looking at
 - ♦ Is there negotiation room? Increases for experience/education?
 - Is there overtime pay?
- Healthcare
 - Are you automatically enrolled into a healthcare plan?
 - How much does it cost?
 - ♦ Is it automatically taken from your salary?
 - ◆ Look up standards for healthcare in the country if you are unsure
- → Benefits
 - Vacation Days
 - Sick Days
 - Personal Days
 - Holidays
- → Work Schedule
 - ♦ Do you work 40 hours a week? Less? More?
 - What days of the week do you work?
- → Upfront Costs
 - ◆ Do you need to pay for:
 - Airfare?
 - Visa or ID?
 - TEFL?
 - Housing Deposit?
- → Contract Length
 - Is it shorter than a year? Longer than a year?
